
Headteacher's Note



Whole school attendance: 96.28%




Online Safety



Online safety remains an important and ever-relevant topic, especially with the many ways children connect and communicate digitally. The National Online Safety (NoS) organisation offers excellent resources for parents, including clear, easy-to-read leaflets on popular apps and websites. These guides include key information, tips for parents, and recommended age ratings. Several parents have mentioned that their children regularly use WhatsApp and Snapchat, both of which have a minimum age requirement of 13. We encourage all parents to take an active role in monitoring their child's online activity and to have regular conversations about digital safety. Attached to this newsletter are two NoS leaflets for your reference. I will also be hosting this month's Parent Forum on Online Safety this Friday and online, on 14th May.
